The following books have been noted after a year when no books were reviewed in Historic Argyll.

Walk for fun from Oban by John H Burton

A 10-page booklet by our own John Burton, self-published in 2002 at £1.75. This follows John's 1997 account of walking the West Highland Way- Walk this Way- which is still available at £3.00. John does not put his name on the cover, modest man, but these unpretentious booklets take up no space in the rucksack unlike the following two books!

The Small Isles, Canna Rum Eigg & Muck by Denis Rixson ISBN 184158 154 2. Birlinn, Edinburgh, 2001, 213 pp., £7.99. I gave my copy to Captain McQuade of the Lochnevis, currently on the Small Isles run. This is a valiant attempt to cover all the isles in one book. At the other end of the scale we have:-

Rum by John A Love Birlinn, Edinburgh, 2001. 300 pp., £14.99 and:-

Canna, the Story of a Hebridean Island by John Lorne Campbell ISBN 1841580104. Birlinn, Edinburgh, 2002, 360 pp., £12.99.

This comprehensive 1984 book, which covered all aspects of his much-loved isle, has been republished, with an introduction and epilogue by Hugh Cheape. It is full of interest, from the times of St Columba to the second half of the 20th century. The island was gifted to the National Trust in 1981, along with John Lorne's library and Gaelic sound archive. His widow still lives in the big house today.

Marion's classic from 1977 has been republished with a flexible cover.

I regret I have been unable to view this book anywhere in Oban and cannot afford to buy it. Having bought and reviewed Volume I earlier, I am sure that Volume 2, which covers the period from Flodden to the Glorious Revolution, will be of an equally high standard.

Barra and the Bishop's Isles by Keith Branigan & Patrick Foster ISBN 0 7524 1947 1. Tempus Publishing, Stroud, 2002, 160 pp., £16.99. For Archaeology enthusiasts, this book covers 6000 years of history up to the time of the 19th century migrations. Keith is Professor of Archaeology and History at the University of Sheffield and the book describes 13 years of work covering 2000 sites and 50 excavations.

A comprehensive history of this Mull church by two members of Mull Historical Society.
